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### **Growth and Partnerships**By Jessica Locher, Executive Director

Here at ECHO, we are lucky to have an amazing set of staff, donors, volunteers and board of directors who help us with our mission of meeting housing, food and other basic human needs and addressing the barriers to self-sufficiency. A staff member pointed out and I totally agree – we are like the animated series *Captain Planet*. Each of us (Planeteers) has our own powers and united as one we are ECHO (Captain Planet). "By your powers combined, I am Captain Planet!" — Captain Planet, upon his every arrival to save the world. Let's talk about the different Planeteers that share their powers at ECHO.

Our donors and volunteers are the backbone of our strongest services – ECHO's Food Program. Without them we would not be able to hand out over 2.5 million meals on an annual basis. In 2022, over 7,700 hours were donated by volunteers in our food pantry. These volunteers pack and hand out food to those in our community who are food insecure. They keep the pantry stocked and check dates to ensure we are handing out healthy, safe foods. They also help unload food that the ECHO truck picks up. Our donors help ensure that we have funds to fill the needs in the pantry that are not donated by local businesses and keep our utilities current so we can utilize our refrigeration units in the pantry. The donations also ensure we have trained staff to work with our neighbors in need and help them address their barriers to self-sufficiency. Donors also help keep the families housed or help the homeless access shelter in local motels through ECHO's Housing Programs.

The ECHO Board of Directors provides needed guidance to ensure we are meeting our mission statement and have adequate resources along with effective organizational planning. With their help, ECHO has grown over the last 50-plus years. In 1969, ECHO was just a food pantry/clothing depot. With the board's guidance, we have expanded to over 20 services, with many focusing on housing and homeless services. Some of our current board members have been a part of our board, on and off, since the 70's. It is amazing to listen to them talk about how things were done many years ago.

Lastly, our staff at ECHO has over 200 combined years of experience in this field. Each of the staff brings a different perspective to how we do business here at ECHO. We follow guidance from grants that we receive, but when we create the programmatic pieces for our services, we sit down to get feedback from our staff. Our staff is dedicated to the mission of ECHO and these staff members are amazing stewards of what is donated to provide services. We currently have two social service staff to help meet the needs our expanding population of Spanish speaking neighbors. Our social service staff has evolved over the years from volunteers to paid staff requiring higher learning degrees in social work or human service or a work history in either field. This transition has led ECHO to have access to additional grant funding for housing and homeless services. To ensure our social service staff stays up to date on best practices, they attend monthly training on relevant topics such as cultural competency, unconscious bias, mental illness, domestic violence, crisis management, just to name a few.

All ECHO staff and volunteers have compassion and serve our neighbors in need with dignity and respect each and every time they come in. All of us together with our donors combine our powers to help our neighbors in need with food, housing and other supportive services!
