Every day, ECHO serves clients who are either on the brink of or are currently experiencing homelessness. No two cases are the same, and one might be surprised to see some of the people who come in given the images of homelessness portrayed on TV shows and in movies as panhandlers, hustlers, people who don't want to work, and people who are lazy. However, those who are unhoused do have to work hard, but it doesn't usually get them into a position to afford housing. A person experiencing homelessness does not have a safe place to lay their head each evening; They don't even have a safe place to keep their belongings. They are moved from one location to

another because there are no permanent locations for them. On rainy or cold winter nights, there's no respite. They are unable to turn up the heat or crawl deep under their covers while the thunder roars or the sleet pelts down. Once someone loses their home, it becomes very difficult to maintain or find a job. When looking for a job they often don't have an address to use and are unable to get their mail. If they don't have a place to live, they do not have access to showers or laundry services. If they have cell phones, they don't have places to charge them.

Often clients will come in having to choose between a rent payment and a car repair, medical bill or some other unexpected or life-altering bill. When this happens, they can fill out a request for rent assistance. This application is filled out by both our client and their landlord. Including the landlord in the process lets them know that their tenant is making every effort to pay their rent. Once the application is filled out and returned to ECHO, an appointment is made for our client to meet with a client representative who will help determine if we are able to help them pay their rent. If we can help, we make the payment directly to the landlord. ECHO is able to offer qualified assistance to the majority of those who make appointments with us, and we are usually able to issue payment within 5-10 days of the appointment. If they do not qualify for assistance and have children, we will refer them to the Job Center, which may be able to help them with emergency assistance.

Although it is a goal of ECHO to keep people in their homes, we still have people experiencing homelessness in our community. ECHO is acutely aware of the plight of homelessness and works diligently to partner with other agencies in our community to combat it. My next article will address what ECHO does once a person or family becomes homeless. We have several programs to address this ever-growing population, and I'm eager to share them with you. If you're wondering what you can do now, please consider advocating to politicians about providing funding for affordable housing and funding to agencies who offer homeless services. Ask for changes in zoning and ordinances to make it easier to build all kinds of affordable housing (including, but not limited to tiny houses in various neighborhoods). Your continued support of local agencies that provide services is greatly appreciated. Thank you for caring about our neighbors.

How long have you volunteered at ECHO?




